## **Ten Black Dots**

## Standard: \*counting review\*

<u>Objective</u>: By the end of the activity, students will review counting numbers between 1 and 10 by using black stickers to create a picture and writing the number of stickers they used.

## Subject: Math

<u>Materials:</u> *Ten Black Dots* by Donald Crews, black sticker sheets, half sheet white construction paper, crayons

## <u>Lesson Structure:</u>

- 1. Read Ten Black Dots
- 2. (I do)
  - a. Recreate a picture from the book using black dot stickers, make sure students understand that they should use their imagination to create something new.
- 3. (We do)
  - a. Ask what we can do with three black dots and take examples from students
  - b. Ask what we can do with one black dot and take examples
  - c. Explain activity and have students collect materials
- 4. (You do)
  - a. Students will be given the rest of the time before recess to begin placing their stickers and planning a picture.
  - b. Give two-minute warning and explain they can finish after recess.
- 5. Review
  - a. Students come in from recess, finish picture, write number of stickers on their paper.
  - b. Transition to Canvas/Compass activity
